

MINUTES OF THE THIRD MEETING OF THE STEERING COMMITTEE ON INTEGRATED WATERSHED MANAGEMENT PROGRAMME (IWMP) HELD ON 11.09.2009 UNDER THE CHAIRMANSHIP OF SECRETARY (LR) AT NBO BUILDING, NIRMAN BHAVAN, NEW DELHI

The third meeting of the Steering Committee on Integrated Watershed Management Programme (IWMP) was held on 11.09.2009 under the chairmanship of Secretary (LR) at NBO Building, Nirman Bhavan, New Delhi. The list of participants is at Annexure-I. The second meeting of the Steering Committee was held on 09.09.2009.

The Secretary (LR) welcomed the participants and requested the Programme Officers of the DoLR to present the proposals received from the States to the Committee. The programme officers made a presentation on State Perspective & Strategic Plan and Preliminary Project Reports submitted in respect of new projects under IWMP by the SLNAs of Uttarakhand, Chhattisgarh and Rajasthan.

During the discussions, the State representatives from Uttarakhand, Chhattisgarh and Rajasthan suggested that the central funds under IWMP be released directly to the SLNAs instead of routing the funds through DRDAs/ ZPs for smooth implementation and monitoring of the programme. In this context, the Chairperson informed that this issue was raised in the earlier meetings of the Steering Committee also and, that the NRAA has already been requested to take up this matter in the Executive Committee of NRAA for making necessary amendments in the Guidelines to streamline the fund flow.

The Chairperson requested all the State representatives to popularize one-year Diploma course on Watershed Management, being sponsored by DoLR and to be launched by IGNOU in January 2010 among the rural youth so that the skilled manpower is available at the village level.

With reference to the presentation of the Uttarakhand proposals, the State representative informed that out of 1110 micro-watersheds in the State, 539 micro-watershed have been covered under various watershed schemes in the State. The Chairman enquired about the impact of the watershed programmes in the treated areas. The State representative informed that an evaluation study conducted by The Energy Research Institute (TERI) has indicated that the programme has resulted into strong social

mobilization, equity, greater participation of weaker section in planning and decision making, increase in employment, 10% increase in irrigated area and increase in the income of people.

It was pointed out that the mandatory certificates signed by the CEO, SLNA have been enclosed with all the proposals but the letter of authority by State Govt. authorizing the CEO, SLNA to sign mandatory certificates has not been furnished. The State representative assured that the same will be submitted within a week.

Regarding the livelihoods interventions proposed by the State, the Committee advised the State to explore the possibilities of introducing village eco-tourism, cold water fisheries, food processing and other NRM based project activities for the asset-less people in the project areas. Further it was emphasized that Uttarakhand having a rich and diverse cultural heritage with vast unexplored potential, the State may identify innovative livelihood activities and up-scale these with the involvement of management and marketing experts by federating the SHGs.

On the issue of quality of drinking water, the State representative was advised to get factual status from the project villages and incorporate the same in the DPRs. The CEO, SLNA, Rajasthan pointed out that low-cost drinking water treatment plants are required in some of the problem villages. The Committee suggested that such activities can be taken up under the component of Entry Point Activities in the project villages.

For the projects proposed for 2009-10, it was brought to the notice of the Committee that the area proposed for treatment in the projects had been kept at 5000 Ha. for all the projects. The State representative clarified that the actual area to be taken up for treatment in each project will be determined at the survey for preparation of DPR. The committee agreed to approve the project areas provisionally for 5000 ha subject to revision of cost later as per the actual area taken up for treatment.

DIG (IWDP) informed that Uttarakhand has requested for 34 projects over an area of 170000 ha against the minimum target allocation of 50000 ha. It was pointed out that in some projects, isolated watersheds were taken. The State representative assured that necessary corrections will be made to replace these to form a contiguous cluster.

The Committee appraised and approved all the 34 projects proposed by Uttarakhand. However, the Committee recommended that the funds in 10 projects in Uttarakhand over an

area of 50000 ha may be sanctioned in the first instance. The remaining projects in the State may be sanctioned after taking stock of demands received from other States.

Regarding the proposals of the Chhattisgarh, it was observed that the selection of Project Implementing Agencies (PIA) for implementing the projects was not rational as a number of PIAs were from different Departments. It was also noted that in case of six projects, Voluntary Organizations were proposed as PIAs by SLNA without following the selection criteria specified in the Common Guidelines for Watershed Projects, 2008. Further, the maps presented by SLNA before the Committee was only location maps for the projects and did not indicate areas covered by the ongoing projects and projects proposed for 2009-10. The State representative was advised to take necessary action and resubmit the proposals to the Steering Committee.

It was also suggested to the State representative of Chhattisgarh to include institutions *viz.*, Water Technology Centre for Eastern Region, Bhubaneswar, Central Soil & Water Conservation Research & Training Institute Research Centre, Koraput and IGNOU Centre, Raipur for capacity building activities under IWMP. Under livelihoods State it was suggested to popularize tribal arts, paintings and also to include region specific livelihoods in the proposal.

During the discussion on the expected outcomes in the proposal submitted by Rajasthan, the chairperson suggested to check the data furnished for different items in pre-project & post-project status and make corrections, if required. The cropping pattern proposed to be taken up after the treatment should not include fertility depleting and high water consuming crops. It was suggested to include cropping systems with legume crops which will improve the soil fertility. It was further suggested that the State should consult agriculture experts before deciding the cropping pattern to be promoted in the project areas.

Regarding the livelihoods interventions proposed by Rajasthan, the Committee advised the State to explore the possibilities under tourism & related activities, area specific livelihood activities like silver jewelry making, folk music, tie & dye art, block & boutique painting, weaving, goat wool shawl making, spice seed etc.

Further, the Committee suggested the State to select more institutions for capacity building and furnish strategy for implementation of capacity building activities under the IWMP.

Director (DDP) informed that Rajasthan has requested for 162 projects over an area of 925599 ha. against the minimum target allocation of 8.0 lakh ha. and have selected the Department of Watershed & Soil Conservation as the PIA for IWMP.

The Committee appraised and approved all the projects proposed by Rajasthan. However, the Committee recommended that the funds in 140 projects in Rajasthan over an area of 807739 ha may be sanctioned in the first instance. Remaining 22 projects covering an area of 117860 ha in the State may be sanctioned after taking stock of demands received from other States.
