

**MINUTES OF THE ELEVENTH MEETING OF THE STEERING COMMITTEE ON INTEGRATED WATERSHED MANAGEMENT PROGRAMME (IWMP) HELD ON 10.03.2010 UNDER THE CHAIRMANSHIP OF SECRETARY (LR) AT UNNATI, KRISHI BHAVAN, NEW DELHI**

The 11<sup>th</sup> meeting of the Steering Committee on Integrated Watershed Management Programme (IWMP) was held on 10.03.2010 under the chairmanship of Secretary (LR) at Unnati, Krishi Bhavan, New Delhi. The list of participants is at Annexure-I.

The Secretary (LR) welcomed the participants and requested the Programme Officers of the DoLR to present the proposals received from the States to the Committee. The Programme Officer made a presentation on the proposals submitted by **Uttar Pradesh**. It was informed that proposals for 40 Districts in non-Bundelkhand region of Uttar Pradesh and 7 Districts in Bundelkhand region of Uttar Pradesh, total amounting to 3.55 lakh ha for the year 2009-10 has already been appraised and cleared by the Steering committee in its earlier meetings.

The present proposal is for remaining 23 Districts of Uttar Pradesh in non-Bundelkhand region covering an area of 1.44 lakh ha (33 projects) for the year 2009-10. It was informed that the Steering Committee had earlier appraised these proposals in its tenth meeting held on 28.01.2010 and recommended for reworking the projects by regrouping/splitting for manageable sizes (less than 6500 ha) and to resubmit the same before the Committee after obtaining the approval of SLNA. Accordingly, these proposals are being put up before the Steering Committee on the recommendation of SLNA, Uttar Pradesh.

The Committee observed that the livelihood options proposed are inadequate. These options require enrichment and innovation in consultation with beneficiaries and the line departments implementing the project. There should be definite focus on value addition and introducing technology into rural areas. The livelihood options should be specific to category of individuals viz., marginal farmers, landless labourers, etc.

The representative from NABARD suggested to get inputs on livelihood options from the watershed programmes being supported by them. This information is available on their website. The Principal Secretary (LDWR), Govt. of U.P. informed that this aspect will be looked into at the stage of DPR preparation.

Responding to the information given by Principal Secretary, Govt. of U.P. regarding formation of independent entity, DWDU, under the chairmanship of District Collector, the Committee clarified that Watershed Cell cum Data Centre (WCDC) within DRDA is to be set up at District level as an entity within DRDA and wherever the project area exceeds 25000 ha, the WCDC can be further strengthened within the norms laid down by DoLR.

The Committee observed that Ghaziabad and Gautam Budh Nagar Districts are primarily urban areas. It would be appropriate to know the future land use which has been planned by authorities like Ghaziabad Development Authority, NOIDA & Greater NOIDA. At this stage, these Districts may be excluded from the purview of consideration. The Principal Secretary (LDWR), Govt. of U.P., informed that these two Districts can be considered at a later stage after studying the future land use planned by the development authorities.

Hence, after considering the district-wise proposals, the Committee appraised and cleared 31 projects over an area of 1,34,388 ha in 21 Districts, after excluding Ghaziabad & Gautam Budh Nagar, for the year 2009-10 (Details furnished in Annexure-II).

The Programme Officer made a presentation on the proposals submitted by **Madhya Pradesh**. It was informed that proposals for 6.23 lakh ha have already been appraised and cleared by the Steering Committee in its 4<sup>th</sup> meeting held on 16.09.2009. Out of this 6.23 lakh ha, an area of 0.79 lakh ha belongs to 4 Districts of Bundelkhand region of Madhya Pradesh – Datia, Panna, Sagar & Tikamgarh. The present proposal is for taking up additional 4.78 lakh ha in 6 Districts of Bundelkhand region – Chhatarpur, Damoh, Datia, Panna, Sagar & Tikamgarh. Out of this 4.78 lakh ha, proposal for 2009-10 is for 0.69 lakh ha in 3 Districts of Bundelkhand i.e. Chhatarpur, Damoh and Sagar.

In the meeting, it was clarified that forest areas should not be included under IWMP. The CEO, SLNA, Madhya Pradesh informed that the area of 4.78 lakh ha proposed now does not include any forest area. NRAA representative informed that a separate provision for treatment of degraded forest areas is available under Bundelkhand Package which may be utilized for the development of degraded forest areas.

In the livelihood options, responding to the information given by CEO, SLNA, M.P., that sorghum residue is being used for particle board manufacture, NRAA representative

expressed the concern that such use of sorghum residue will be counter-productive for livestock. It was suggested that sorghum residue can be stored as fodder for long time and it can provide drought resilience to the people of Bundelkhand who witness frequent droughts.

The representative from Central Ground Water Board (CGWB) informed the Committee that CGWB is willing to assist PIAs in assessing the outcomes in terms of improvement in ground water level as a consequence of watershed development activities. He further informed that Scientists of CGWB are in place in every district of Uttar Pradesh. There is a need to integrate their expertise for successful implementation of IWMP.

During the presentation, the choice of PIA could not be clarified. The Committee desired that the same may be clearly spelt out while issuing the Sanction Order by SLNA, Madhya Pradesh. Selection of VOs/ NGOs as PIA should be strictly in accordance with the Common Guidelines for Watershed Development Projects, 2008.

During the discussions, the CEO, SLNA informed the Committee that during the recent field visits in Panna District, the cropping pattern in the project areas under IWDP has undergone a change. The farmers are now taking up wheat in place of crops like linseed, bengal gram, etc. cultivated earlier. The Committee desired the CEO, SLNA to get an evaluation study conducted in that area and furnish a copy of the report to DoLR.

Hence, after considering the district-wise proposals, the Committee appraised and cleared 70 projects over an area of 3,99,254 ha under Bundelkhand package (Details furnished in Annexure-III). Out of this area, 13 projects (114 microwatersheds) covering 69,514 ha will be taken up during 2009-10. The year-wise breakup of microwatersheds & area to be taken up under Bundelkhand Package during the remaining period of 11<sup>th</sup> Plan is as follows:

Director (DDP) suggested that SLNAs should submit editable version of GIS maps of watersheds in the State to DoLR for facilitating the preparation of National Watershed Atlas by NRSC. He informed that DPR preparations in a number of States like Andhra Pradesh, Arunachal Pradesh, Assam, Gujarat, Karnataka, Nagaland and Tamil Nadu are in advanced stage. The States have communicated that DPR preparation is a time taking exercise and it may take some more time before it is completed. Karnataka has informed that Preliminary DPRs (PDPRs) have been prepared and the Annual Action Plan is based on those PDPRs, while Andhra Pradesh has communicated that DPR preparation is in advanced stage and is progressing well. In the mean time, above States including Karnataka and Andhra Pradesh have requested DoLR to release the balance 14 % part of the first installment. The representative from NRAA and Shri MV Ramachandrudu, Director, WASSAN, were also of the opinion that it would take 1-2 years for preparation of a quality DPR.

After detailed deliberation, the Committee recommended that the balance 14 % of the first installment may be released to concerned SLNAs, provided the SLNAs certify that either the preliminary DPRs have been prepared & approved by SLNA or the DPR preparation is progressing satisfactorily.

The details of projects appraised & cleared by the Committee under IWMP during the year (upto 10.03.10) are enclosed at Annexure-IV.

The meeting ended with a vote of thanks to the Chair.
