

**MINUTES OF THE NINETH MEETING OF THE STEERING COMMITTEE ON  
INTEGRATED WATERSHED MANAGEMENT PROGRAMME (IWMP) HELD ON  
23.12.2009 UNDER THE CHAIRMANSHIP OF ADDITIONAL SECRETARY (LR) AT  
NBO BUILDING, NIRMAN BHAVAN, NEW DELHI**

The 9<sup>th</sup> meeting of the Steering Committee on Integrated Watershed Management Programme (IWMP) was held on 23.12.2009 under the chairmanship of Additional Secretary (LR) at NBO Building, Nirman Bhavan, New Delhi. The list of participants is at Annexure-I. The 8<sup>th</sup> meeting of the Steering Committee was held on 28.10.09.

The Additional Secretary (LR) welcomed the participants and requested the Programme Officers of the DoLR to present the proposals received from the States to the Committee. The Director (DDP) informed the Committee that the State Perspective & Strategic Plan and Preliminary Project Reports (PPR) submitted in respect of new projects under IWMP by the SLNAs of Chhattisgarh (Additional area), Jharkhand, Orissa (additional area) and Uttar Pradesh are being placed before the Committee on 23.12.09.

The Programme Officer informed the Committee that 29 projects covering an area of 1.52 lakh ha. had been appraised and cleared under IWMP to **Chhattisgarh** in the 5<sup>th</sup> Steering Committee meeting held on 18.09.09. The State has now proposed additional 12 projects covering an area of 0.62 lakh ha. for implementation during 2009-10.

The Committee observed that the performance in respect of on-going pre-IWMP projects is poor and the number of projects completed so far is very less as compared to the number due for completion. It was also pointed out that the area taken up for watershed treatment in the last 15 years is very less & the State was asked to take necessary steps to cover more area under the IWMP projects. The Special Secretary (P&RD), Chhattisgarh informed the Committee that all efforts will be made to complete the projects within the time schedule prescribed by DoLR, and assured that the area to be covered in remaining years of 11<sup>th</sup> Plan will be suitably increased.

The State was suggested to include Central Research Institute for Dryland Agriculture (CRIDA), Hyderabad as one of the institute for Capacity Building activities and to exclude Central Arid Zone Research Institute (CAZRI), Jodhpur from the list of Capacity Building institutions.

On the livelihood interventions, the Committee stressed on skill upgradation activities and taking up value addition for better income in the rural areas and training in IT, internet use, etc. so that the rural youth is able to keep pace with the developments in the urban areas.

After considering the district-wise proposals, the Committee appraised and cleared all additional 12 projects covering an area of 62,230.16 lakh ha for the year 2009-10 for Chhattisgarh subject to reworking of treatable area in respect of 3 projects (Jashpur-IMWP-III, Janjgir-Champa-IWMP- I & II) and sanction by SLNA.

The Programme Officer thereafter made a presentation on the proposals submitted by SLNA, **Jharkhand**. It was informed that 24 projects covering a treatable area of 1.52 lakh have been proposed for implementation during the year 2009-10.

The Committee observed that the performance in respect of on-going pre-IWMP projects is very poor and the number of projects completed so far is negligible as compared to the number due for completion. The Committee requested the Special Secretary (RD), Jharkhand to review the same and submit the action proposed to be taken by the State Government to DoLR.

It was observed that the projects proposed by Jharkhand under IWMP had included reserved forest area. Additional Secretary (LR) pointed out that since the projects are to be implemented by the Watershed Committee with people's participation and a Watershed Development fund is to be created for maintenance of assets created under the project and also that livelihoods opportunity for the assetless people in the project area are to be created which would not be otherwise possible in reserved forest areas. The Committee after deliberations agreed that reserved forest areas should not form part of the project area under IWMP. The State representative agreed to exclude reserved forest areas from the proposed projects.

Regarding the projects wherein NGOs have been appointed as PIAs, it was observed by the Additional Secretary (LR), that selection of NGO is responsibility of State Government, if they choose to execute projects through NGOs. However, they have to satisfy themselves about credibility of the organization so chosen. The States were

requested to furnish a certificate, along with the PPRs, that the NGO-PIAs were appointed as per the provisions of the Common Guidelines, 2008.

The Committee observed that NGOs have been proposed as PIAs in respect of 9 projects out of 24 projects during 2009-10, which is more than 25 % as per the provision under Common Guidelines, 2008. In response to this, the State representative requested the Committee that 4 projects viz. Godda-IWMP-III (PIA-PRADAN), Khunti-IWMP-I (PIA-PRADAN), Latehar-IWMP-I (PIA-Citizen Foundation) and West Singhbhum-IWMP-II (PIA-KGVK) may be excluded from the proposed list of IWMP projects for 2009-10.

After considering the district-wise proposals, the Committee appraised and cleared 20 projects of Jharkhand covering an area of 119428.50 ha for the year 2009-10 for Jharkhand.

The representative from NABARD informed the Committee that exposure visits may be undertaken to the watershed projects implemented by NABARD. The Committee requested the representative from NABARD to furnish the list of such projects with details to the DoLR for circulation among the States.

Regarding the presentation on **Orissa**, the Programme Officer informed the Committee that 57 projects covering an area of 2.95 lakh ha. had been appraised and cleared under IWMP to Orissa in the 2<sup>nd</sup> Steering Committee meeting held on 09.09.09. The State has now proposed for additional 8 projects covering an area of 0.41 lakh ha. under IWMP for implementation during 2009-10.

As the expected outcomes projected were for the entire State, the CEO, SLNA was requested to incorporate the data for the concerned project in the DPR. Regarding the drinking water availability in the project area, the Committee suggested the State representative to take a note of the safe drinking water standards recommended by World Health Organization (WHO). The State representative informed the Committee that the above points will be taken care during preparation of DPR.

The CEO, SLNA was advised to furnish district-wise GIS maps indicating Plan-wise micro-watersheds to be taken up under IWMP. After the presentation of district-wise proposals, the Committee cleared all the 8 additional projects covering an area of 41,390 ha for the year 2009-10.

The Programme Officer made a presentation on the proposals submitted by **Uttar Pradesh**. It was informed that 56 projects covering an area of 3.16 lakh ha have been proposed. It was also informed that for all these projects the State Government has proposed Soil Conservation Unit of Dept. of Land Development & Water Resources as PIA.

It was suggested by the Committee to include region specific livelihood activities like brass works (Moradabad), lock works (Aligarh), silk works (Banaras), etc. under the livelihood activities proposed to be taken up under the projects.

Regarding the District-wise projects proposed for 2009-10, the Committee suggested the State representative to make appropriate corrections in the District watershed maps as per the Plan proposed.

After considering the district-wise proposals, the Committee appraised and cleared 42 projects over an area of 2,32,519 ha (*subject to reduction of one microwatershed in Farukhabad – I project from 2009-10 for maintaining as single cluster and adding it to the project area proposed for 2010-11*) for the year 2009-10. The State was suggested to rework 14 projects (Bagpat-I, Bijnor-I, Pilibhit-I, Sitapur-I, Lucknow-I, Hamirpur-I, Allahabad-I, Shravasti-I, Balrampur-I, Gonda-I, Maharajganj-I, Balia-I, Jaunpur-I & Sonbhadra-I) on cluster basis and resubmit the same before the Committee after obtaining the approval of SLNA.

The Committee suggested the Principal Secretary (Land Development & Water Resources), Uttar Pradesh to expedite inclusion of seven Districts of Bundhelkhand region to be covered under '*Bundhelkhand Package*' and propose additional area, if feasible, for treatment during the year 2009-10 under IWMP for appraisal of the Steering Committee in its next meeting likely to be held in January, 2010.

Thus the Committee, after examining the proposals, cleared 12 no. of additional projects in Chhattisgarh over an area of 62,230.16 ha, 20 projects in Jharkhand over an area of 1,19,428.50 ha, 8 additional projects in Orissa over an area of 41,390 ha and 42 projects in Uttar Pradesh covering an area of 2,32,519 ha.
