**Minutes of meeting of Project of Sanctioning and Monitoring Committee (PS&MC)
held on 23 September, 2015**

A meeting was held under the Chairmanship of Secretary on 23 September, 2015 to consider the proposals of the State Governments. A list of the participants is annexed.

Secretary (LR) welcomed the participants and recalled that Cabinet had approved the allocation of Rs.5656 crore to the NLRMP of which an amount of Rs.494.68 crore only has been utilized so far by the State Governments. This is a matter of great concern that only 10% of the funds have been spent in implementation of the NLRMP. He further recalled the objective of the NLRMP which is to develop a modern, comprehensive and transparent land records management system in the country with the ultimate aim to implement the "conclusive land titling system" with guaranteed titles. He added that the funding pattern has recently been changed to 50:50::Central share: State share. He then asked JS (LR) to start the discussions on various agenda items containing state-wise Govt. proposals.

JS (LR) mentioned that the States of Assam, Arunachal Pradesh, Kerala, Delhi and Uttarakhand have huge unspent balances with them which continues to be a cause of concern for the Government. Tripura and Mizoram have utilized significant portion of the funds provided by the Central Govt. He further informed that the format for Management Information System (MIS) has been simplified to enable the State Govt. to fill it up easily for submitting real time information.

1. Assam - Shri A. K. Barman, Deputy Secretary, Revenue, Govt. of Assam presented the proposal. He informed that bidding process for the construction of modern record rooms has been finalized and data centres will be put in place within the current financial year. As regards inter connectivity of revenue offices, the delay occurred because of "Assam State Wide Area Network (ASWAN)" becoming dysfunctional. Now they have decided to use inter-office-connectivity through broad band. BSNL has already submitted the DPR and a sanction will be accorded to complete the work within a month. In respect of survey and resurvey they intend to do the survey of 10000 sq. km. of non-cadastral area.

The Committee considered the proposal and instructed the States to recast the proposal which can be reasonably achieved during the current financial year. The Committee approved the proposal as per annexure and also approved the inter component transfer so as to help the State to achieve their action plan.
